## Christ at the Crossroad of Temptation (Matthew 4:1-11)

*Introduction:* Remember Robert Frost's proverbial fork in the road? More than a pleasant rhyme about a walk in the woods, "The Road Not Taken" is a beautiful metaphor about crossroads, critical junctures that necessitate life-changing decisions. How do we make wise decisions at such crucial times?

### I. Life Has Inevitable Crossroads

A) Paul came to a crucial fork in his life (Acts 9).

1. Paul chose the road less traveled.

2. Years later Paul explained how he had since learned to handle life's crossroads in any circumstance (Phil. 4:11-13).
